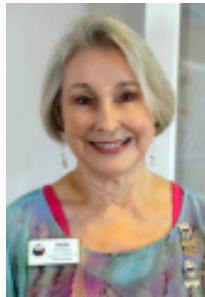

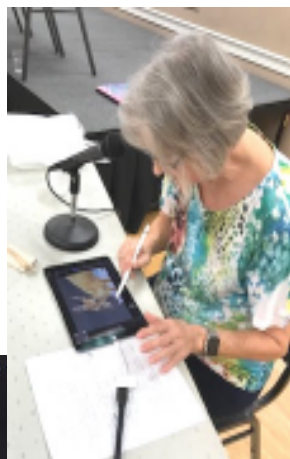

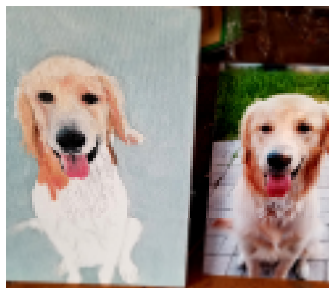
January Demonstration

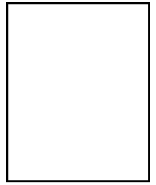
